It is hard to believe that we are now in June and still not able to launch boats! However we are hopeful that we will be getting some good news soon. I spoke with an official at MID recently and he told me the first week of June. Kendall, our dock captain, spoke with someone else at MID and was told the middle of June. In any case we should be close and LYSA club members will be notified as soon as we get positive info.

With the summer solstice rapidly approaching I have been receiving a lot of emails from different sailing organizations promoting organizing a sailing event on the solstice which is June 21st. With this being the longest daylight of the year I thought that LYSA should do something. The 21st falls on a Tuesday so obviously that may not be the best day to plan a LYSA event. I was thinking of Saturday the 25th. My thought is that we do a late afternoon raft up behind the island for boat hopping and appetizers. Then near sunset break up the floating party and set sail until dark or shortly thereafter. We can be on the water until one hour after sunset.

Years ago the club regularly did these raft ups and they were a blast! The way this works is the two largest, heaviest boats that will be participating find the spot and drop their anchor. Next smaller boats side tie up to the first two. Lots of fenders and dock lines are needed. A motor makes maneuvering easier and is especially important for the boats that will drop their anchor to be able to back down and really get dug in. We might also thing about having the committee boat standing by to help as well. It is not that hard and the more experienced sailors will talk the newer sailors through the drill. I will be sending out organizational emails prior to the 25th. It will be important for me to know which boats will be participating so I can sketch out where everyone will be.

There has also been some talk of other activities as well on the 25th so watch your email for updates!

Our next club meeting is scheduled for Tuesday June 14th starting at 6 with a potluck. This is a full moon night so plan on coming out and hollering at the moon with your fellow club members!
