

To celebrate Valentine's Day and Janet's B-day, we took a drive to Morro Bay, Pismo and Santa Barba-




ra... It was beautiful and we got to see this cute sea lion hanging out sun bathing on the rocks in Morro Bay.



LYSA Membership Meeting Call to Order: A meeting of the LYSA Membership and Board was held on February 14, 2023 at Round Table Pizza on Olive Avenue in Merced. The meeting convened at 7:15 pm.

Reports - Actions - Discussions: Commodore, Thom Gri-maldi: Welcomed members to the meeting. Invited Board Members to report.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes are published in the Newsletter, Members can read and review the minutes in advance of the meeting. No comments or corrections. Minutes approved by acclimation.

Commodore, Thom Grimaldi: Shared plans for next year: Work on the fence around yard, Deck / firepit area, Shrimp Feed, Regatta (may be later in the year, Board will discuss date. Tradition has been after Mother's Day)

Vice Commodore, Dan Aleman: Dan asked about the Regatta. Tom explained that there is support for Dan in planning this. Jerry suggested to keep it the weekend after Mother's Day. gested if Members see something like this, they take care of it.

Discussed RSVP Google Form to tighten numbers / buy the proper amount of food for guests.




