Thanks, not only to those named, but to each one who showed up and made it possible. Diane put together sandwiches and Kara baked some cakes for lunch making for tasty lakeside meal.

We accomplished over seven of the work items on the work list. Six of those were considered critical and included replacing the support beam and a support pole under the main gate area. The main gate is no longer listing to port. We replaced or repaired poles on two fingers between slip 2 and 5. They were very unstable and are rock solid once again. Replaced a 9-foot-long support pole on the walkway near slip 42. The original pole was providing minimal support and had allowed the deck to sag about an inch. Replaced an 8-foot support pole at the corner of the race deck and the middle row of slips. Quite a

bit of debris and old concrete chunks were removed from under the dock area. This will help to ensure boats don't snag on it if the water is low and makes a safer sailing experience.

What is next? There are still over 20 items on the work list. But here are the most crucial items. Two fingers in the back row need poles replaced, including the finger that floated away from its anchorage last season. There are several areas that need fresh wood added to support aging timbers. Metal and wood bracing needs to be done, including welding of metal bracing for torsional support and there is still some debris to remove.

We plan to have a workday again Saturday, March 5<sup>th</sup> and probably again on March 19<sup>th</sup>. If you can help one of these workdays, please let me know. This will be discussed at the March membership meeting.



#### **Ahoy Racers!**

California now requires a "Boater Card" to operate a boat with a motor of more than 15 Horsepower. Each year a new age group is added to those who are required to possess a valid card. By 2025, all persons who operate on California waters will be required to have one. Once issued, the card is valid for a boat operator's lifetime.

California Harbors and Navigation Code Section 678.11(b) contains the following phase-in schedule based on operator age:

- January 1, 2022 Persons 45 years or less
- January 1, 2023 Persons 50 years or less
- January 1, 2024 Persons 60 years or les
- January 1, 2025 All, regardless of age

To obtain a California Boater Card visit the DBW Website: https://californiaboatercard.com/ Submit your application - \$10.00 Fee, make note of the Application ID. Participate in one of the recommended/ listed Boating Courses (Free Home Study Course: http://dbw.parks.ca.gov/? page id=28734#homeStudy, or https:// www.boatus.org/california/) and take the test. The course and test will take about 4 hours to com-

plete. The online courses allow you to stop and re-

start, so you don't have to do it all in one go.

I signed up for their "Rules as Tactical Tools" webinar, put on by Dave Perry, and it's quite excellent. Although I cannot share the link to the recorded seminar, I will share the slides and recording of the 8 hour training on 4 consecutive Thursday Evenings – 2 hours each evening – live/ in-person at Steve's house on Parsons Ave – 6:30 – 8:30 in March:

March 3 – Rules and Tactics on the Upwind Legs,

March 10 - Rules and Tactics on the Downwind Legs,

March 17 - Rules and Tactics at the Marks,

March 24 - Rules and Tactics at the start.

Bring a notebook and pen to take notes, your rule book (if you have it), and feel free to bring food and drinks.

LYSA Membership Meeting Call to Order: A meeting of the LYSA Membership was held on February 8, 2022 at the Anderson home on Olive Avenue. The meeting convened at 7:00 pm.

**Reports - Actions - Discussions: Commodore, Jay Sousa:** Jay welcomed members to the meeting. Invited Board Members to report.

**Approval of Minutes:** Minutes read by Chris Martin. Discussion: Deb asked to clarify meeting times. General meeting will be at 7 pm. Rachel: new member Mitch's name is misspelled. The proper spelling is Mitch Vanagten. *Motion*: Moved by Rachel Hadley to approve minutes with corrections, **Second** by Deb Harden. **Motion carried**.

**Commodore, Jay Sousa:** Jay welcomed some guests. Darrell brought Mr. & Mrs. Deweese. Mike Boykin present.

Vice Commodore, Thom Grimaldi: Not present.

**Treasurer, Diane Sousa:** The Treasurer's report was shared. Two new members: Mike and Susan Boykin, Kim Garner & Mitch Vanagten. Some Club dues have been received. Slip fee cutoff March 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Dock Captain, Kendall Nightengale:** Proposed February 19<sup>th</sup> as a work day. The Club may provide lunch. Asked if any member can weld. Suggested Mike Bloed, reach out to club members to ask. Jacks and cribbing are needed to lift up the structure to replace the crossbeam.

House Captain, Deb Harden: Craig fixed the leak in front of the Clubhouse, concrete replaced. Back door would not latch, a handyman added shims so now the door closes properly. The metal door and garage door locks need some graphite. If Members have a problem with the locks, try wiggling the keys a bit. The dumpsters were not locked. They MUST be locked. Diane will call to ensure that Waste Management is locking the dumpsters. Deb asked about the date to switch from Winter to Summer storage.

Race Captain: Rachel Hadley: North Sails puts on seminars, Dave Perry is quite good. Encouraged Members to check out the North Sails website to see if any trainings are of interest. Kendall can post links on the LYSA Website.

Junior Sailing, Matt Loeffler: Brigitte and Matt are passing on Admin of the program to Bridget Farmer. They will run a full Sail Camp program this year but will transition next year to Bridget. She has been with Junior Sailing since she was 8 and was one of Jay's first sailors. Brigitte will meet with Ken-

dall to work on updating the program information on the LYSA website.

Need: One main and one jib and that will wipe out the Junior Sailing budget for the Capris. The cost is \$1400.

Thanked Jerry Rokes and Darrell Sorensen for all the work they do to support Junior Sailing.

Sea Scouts: Not present.

#### **Old Business:**

Card for Mike Strealy's Mom passed, Chris will send card. Regatta: Jay - Members need to pitch in to help with the Regatta. 8-9 people can not do it alone. Income from this event goes to the Improvement Fund. Encouraged Club Members to race or camp out at the Lake during the event. Jerry spoke to Rebecca, will send the County our information. Jerry: t-shirt contest years ago. Jerry shared proposed t-shirt design to Members. Submit other design ideas to Jerry or Norm, to be voted on during the March meeting. John Derby suggested shirts with no date.

Open House / Shrimp Feed: This event is a lot of work. Jay stated that we need a massive buy-in from the Membership. It's a long day and it's a lot of work. We need more helpers. We will discuss this again in March.

Yard / Deck project: Thom Grimaldi is spearheading this. He has a nice drawing of the proposed construction. Defer to March when we can have some cost estimates and we can vote on it. Regatta and Open House monies from the Club Improvement fund will be used for this project. Deb asked we refer to it as a deck.

**New Business:** Burgees: Jay would like to see Club Members using burgees. Diane will call to get a cost from the manufacturer and will work out the cost to Members.

John Derby: Discussed importance of publicity to our Club. Getting people involved. Would like to work with someone in the Club to promote Club activities. One example: Sailors who need crew or crew who don't have boats. Jay: logistically a nightmare to publish. Discussion: publish afterward to avoid. Kendall: news crew to film racing. Jay: community – if they have an interest, proceed cautiously, but ensure new members have an interest in the Club. Norm suggested Cruise / Social can work to submit articles to the County Times or contact news outlets to inform the public about events held at LYSA.

Craig: Merced Integrated Water Management Association — we need to do dredging near the docks. Craig informed the person we have budgeted monies for docks repair. The person wants to demolish the docks and put in new state-of-the -art docks. There is money from Build America and the County has money. Under consideration at the moment. Garth Peccinino is a member of that organization. California Waterways has been absorbed by California Parks and they have other projects in the works.

Jay: concern about cost, concerned about relationship between MID and the County. Let's proceed cautiously. **Good of the order:** Talked to Dennis, he's talked to Marvin Hendricks – he's doing well. Living in Kansas.

Diane: gave Craig tags for Committee boat and Rich Kleitman's two Sea Scouts boats.

**Motion**: Moved by Rachel Hadley to adjourn, second by John Derby. **Motion carried**. Board meeting was adjourned at 8:15. After a brief break, the Board Meeting was convened.

Dock work - Not discussed.


Website – Kendall showed the Board the new website. Board Members can edit their own pages within the website. Each Board Member could upload content or send it to Kendall and he can upload it to the page.
